Appropriately, the stars were the Prince and Cinderella, closely followed by the Ugly Sisters and their terrible Mother. However, it was the performances of the young Players – Buttons, The Page, the Dogs, the Fairies, and the Villagers which delighted the audience. Kate Ansell's solo singing enchanted every evening. Her real-life mother proved her versatility as Dandini. The Punk Fairy, Tamsin Blackmore, became more outrageous with every performance.

Bernie Martin cut out 110m of fabric, did no housework for six weeks, and could be found dazed constructing giant spiders in his shop Nimble Fingers. The backstage team led by Chris Dubery, Steve Hall, Liz Stanbury, Colin Denham, with designs from Amanda Graham, managed the hugely demanding scene changes, sound and lighting without a hitch. Departing audiences praised the bold show and the professionalism of Tom Lock'sprofessional souvenir programme. 50 people staged this production including our new pianist Hugh Davies, musical director April Golding, and choreographer Nicola Smith.
